2023 grant program update

As we reported to you in the winter issue of The Loop, the RTOERO Foundation opened a new granting cycle on September 21, 2022.

The overarching goal of our annual grant program is to identify and partner with creative, results-based organizations in order to address the most critical issues faced by our aging population. The RTOERO Foundation awards grants between \$10,000 and \$50,000 to projects that aim to improve seniors' health and wellness, promote social engagement for older adults and pursue innovative research in the field of geriatrics and gerontology.

This fall we received a record-setting 81 letters of intent and invited 48 applicants to submit full proposals, which have been reviewed by our peer review panel. All three of our focus areas mentioned above were represented in a number of very strong proposals.

Recommendations for funding from the peer review panel are presented to the RTOERO Foundation's board of directors, which provides final approval.

Grants under consideration come from both academic bodies and community organizations. Each project under consideration offers value-added outputs, which will help us improve the lives of all RTOERO members – and all seniors across Canada.

The list of approved grantees will be announced in March and a full description of these winning projects will be presented in our summer issue of The Loop.

Multigenerational households



One of the effects of the ongoing affordable housing crisis in Canada is a growing number of adults opting to live with their parents. According to the 2021 Census, there were nearly 442,000 multigenerational households in Canada. These only account for 2.9 percent of all private households but are home to 2.4 million people. Multigenerational households have increased in number by 50 percent since 2001.

The advantages of multigenerational households go beyond the obvious financial benefits. Adults and children benefit from spending significant time with multiple generations. It can help resolve feelings of loneliness and isolation among older family members. Being around children improves cognitive function, increases energy levels and provides a sense of purpose.

Similarly, children of all ages benefit from being close to older relatives. Language development, literacy, life skills, goal setting and empathy are some of the positives associated with growing up with grandparents. Living with family members of other generations helps with bonding, self-esteem and a sense of belonging.

Multigenerational households help strengthen bonds, enhance relationships among family members and create cultural connections. Having multiple generations under one roof can also ease the burden of child care and help with the care of older family members.

The trend of multigenerational housing is showing no signs of slowing down as more Canadian families are embracing this way of living.
